The Shuttle will leave the center at 1:00 p.m. for an hour at the store and then passengers will be taken home.

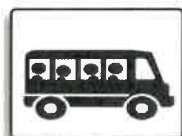

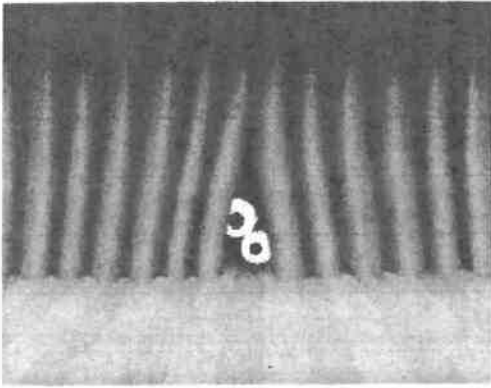
